Since our log cabin beginnings 163 years ago, the members of St. Peter's Lutheran Church and School have been moving faithfully forward, sharing the saving gospel of Jesus Christ. Presently, the Lord has blessed our church with nearly 2,000 members focused on:

CONNECTING to Christ

GROWING in His grace; and

SHARING Him with Others

In 2012, we moved forward in faith, undertaking a \$6.6 million project to update our day school facility and add a 28,000 sq. ft. ministry complex and gymnasium to our church facility. This addition is the foundation for a three-phase master plan to further expand our ministry. Ensuing phases include a new school facility to the south of our addition and a new sanctuary and ministry spaces to the west of our current sanctuary. With great joy we dedicated our new facilities in the fall of 2014 completing phase one of the Master Plan.









Just the Beginning!

Our new addition has certainly enhanced our mission.

- Our elderly and those with disabilities now have full access to the building.
- •Our pastors and staff have adequate work spaces.
- Additional meeting rooms allow for more Bible studies, fellowship groups, and training to engage more people in ministry leadership.
- Well-furnished preschool classrooms have allowed that ministry to reach more and more children and young families.
- •The new gymnasium is so popular among athletic teams, youth groups, and parish event planners that it requires its own scheduling calendar.
- •The fully equipped kitchen has prepared numerous meals for our STEPS program, ladies' groups, older adult ministries, funeral gatherings, and confirmation classes.

And we've only just begun to explore the ministry possibilities in the future!

Our Challenge

We are anxious to explore where God might lead St. Peter's in the future, but first we must retire our current debt. We are in the process of completing the second of two successful capital campaigns. Now, we begin Faithfully FORWARD.

Here is our challenge:

Total Building Cost - \$6.6 Million
Projected Loan Balance at 1/1/19 - \$3.5 Million
(includes \$1.1 million in interest over the first two campaigns)

Our **Faithfully FORWARD** goal is to reduce, or Lord willing, eliminate our remaining debt over the next four years.
